

Setting up a basic museum database

The example below shows a simple layout for a museum database for the objects in a museum's collection.

These use specialist software, but a simple one can be created using spreadsheet software such as Microsoft Excel.

Each object in the database has a unique number to identify it.



Dropdown menus:

- Make it quicker to fill in the data.
- Ensure different curators are choosing from the same options, keeping the data consistent.
